# Peer Support Craft Group Support

Hull and East Yorkshire Mind are seeking a volunteer to support the leader of our new Peer Support Craft Group, aimed at enhancing the emotional resilience of people aged 16 and over through creativity. As a group support volunteer, you will play an important role in helping participants develop positive coping strategies, build social connections, and improve their mental wellbeing through engaging craft projects.

#### What will the role involve?

- Assisting with the setup of the space, preparing craft materials, and ensuring refreshments are available.
- Welcoming participants, offering one-on-one support when needed, and encouraging group interaction.
- Helping to create and maintain a supportive, inclusive environment where everyone feels safe.
- Upholding confidentiality and always respecting personal boundaries.
- Assisting with clean-up after the sessions to ensure the space is ready for the next use.
- Participating in any relevant training and activities to enhance your skills in supporting the group.

## What skills and experience are we looking for?

- Excellent communication skills and the ability to engage with participants effectively.
- Experience working with people aged 16 or over (this is desirable but not essential).
- A proactive, motivated approach to supporting the group leader and participants.
- The ability to take initiative and adapt to different situations.
- Flexibility, resilience, and a commitment to reliability.

### What will you gain from supporting this group?

- The opportunity to make a meaningful impact in the lives of individuals who may be struggling with their mental health.
- Experience working with a diverse group of individuals aged 16+.
- Enhanced understanding of mental health issues and their effect on the community.
- The chance to develop your organisational, teamwork, and communication skills.
- A supportive team environment with opportunities to meet new people.
- Full training and continuous support from our team to help you succeed in the role.
